NEET-UG TO BE HELD IN PEN, **PAPER MODE**

NEW DELHI, 16 JAN

The Centre has decided against conducting the medical entrance exam NEET-UG in online mode for now, and announced on Thursday it will continue to be conducted in

pen and paper mode.
The decision comes after detailed deliberations between education and health ministries on whether to conduct the NEET-UG in pen and paper mode or online

"NEET-UG shall be conducted in a single day and shift," a senior National Testing Agency (NTA) official said on Thursday.
The National Eligibility-

cum-Entrance (NEET) is the largest entrance exam in the country in terms of number of candidates appearing for the test. In 2024, a record more than 24 lakh candidates took the exam. The NTA conducts the NEET every year for admission into medical colleges. A total of 1,08,000 seats are available for MBSS course.

The idea of switching to Computer-Based Test (CBT) mode for NEET is not new and has been deliberated several times before. However, the push for the exam reforms came following the paper leak controversy last vear. —PTI

Hindenburg Research, which made international waves with campaigns targeting bil-lionaire Gautam Adani that wiped billions of dollars from the market value of his group companies, will disband, its founder Nate Anderson announced on Thursday.
The announcement

Anderson, 40, who started the company in 2017, came days before Donald Trump's inauguration as the new US President.

Anderson cited the toll of the "rather intense, and at times, all encompassing" nature of the work as the reason for his decision. However, critics were quick to link the development to Hindenburg's alleged ties with George Soros and the

so-called deep state being under significant pressure from the incoming Trump administration.

Adani Group CFO Jugeshinder Robbie Singh, in a cryptic post on X, said, "Kitne Ghazi Gaye."

Typically, short-sellers like Anderson, who managed his firm's own money but not that nies they believe are plagued with mismanagement or involved in some fraud/scam. They borrow a stock to sell it in the expectation the price will fall, then repurchase the shares and pocket the differ-

Hindenburg in January 2023 published a report accusing the Adani Group of "pulling the largest con in the corporate history", wiping out more

than USD 150B in value of the group's shares at their lowest

Adani Group vehemently denied all allegations, including that of being "engaged in a brazen stock manipulation and accounting fraud scheme over the course of decades" and improper use of offshore tax havens to shore up group share prices. —PTI

India becomes 4th nation to dock satellites in space

ISRO conducted space-docking of satellites under SpaDex

BENGALURU, 16 JAN

In a major boost to India's ambitious future space missions, ISRO on Thursday successfully performed the docking of satellites as part of the Space Docking Experiment (SpaDeX) and announced that post docking, control of two satellites as a single object was also achieved.

With the successful docking

of satellites — Chaser and Target — India has become the fourth country after the US, Russia and China to accomplish the technological

In space, docking technology is essential when multiple rocket launches are required to achieve common mission objectives.

The docking experiment is crucial for Chandrayaan-4, Gaganyaan, setting up a space station and landing an astronaut on the moon.

Last October, the govern-

ment announced that India will have its own Space Station Further, ISRO said: "Post docking, control of two satel-

Congress moves SC to oppose pleas against Worship Law

Congress on Thursday moved Supreme Court to intervene in cases filed against the validity Places of Worship (Special Provisions) Act 1991, which preserves the character of religious places as they existed on

August 15, 1947.
The party, which was instrumental in introducing and passing the Act, argues that it reflects the mandate of the Indian people and is vital for

safeguarding secularism.

In an application filed by Congress leader KC Venugopal, the party said that the Act, passed by a Congress-led government with Janata Dal support, protects religious freedom and communal harmony.

The plea said that the 1991

upholds fundamental rights under Articles 25, 26, 27, and 28, making it within Parliament's jurisdiction to enact.

It seeks to intervene and defend the Act's constitutional validity in response to petitions challenging Sections 3 and 4, which prohibit altering

As many as 12 Naxalites were killed in a fierce encounter with security forces in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district on Thursday, a senior police official said.

The gunfight broke out at around 9 am in a forest of south Bijapur when a joint team of security personnel was out an anti-Naxalite operation and the intermittent exchange of fire lasted till late in the evening, he said.

Personnel belonging to the state police's District Reserve

Guard (DRG) from three dis-CoBRA battalions (Commando Battalion for Resolute Action - an elite jungle warfare unit of the CRPF) and the 229th battalion of CRPF were involved in the operation, he

With this, 26 Naxalites have been gunned down in separate encounters in the state so far this month. Last year, 219 Naxalites were neutralised by security forces.

BIDAR, 16 JAN In a shocking incident in Bidar, miscreants opened fire on staff

members from the State Bank of India (SBI) as they arrived to deposit cash into an ATM. The incident occurred outside the SBI head office, resulting in the immediate death of a staff memidentified as Giri Venkatesh.

Another victim, Shivakumar, 26, suffered severe injuries and was rushed to BIMS Hospital in Bidar for emergency treatment. The attackers targeted a vehicle used for cash deposits, and, during the assault, they threw powdered salt into the staff members' eyes before firing five rounds and making off with an estimated Rs 93 lakh.

District Superintendent of Police Pradeep Gunti confirmed that the shooting took place around 11am when the assailants, riding a motorcycle. attacked the bank staff.

The robbers, who fled to Telangana after the Bidar heist, entered a travel office in Afzalganj, Hyderabad, where

they shot the manager before escaping. According to sources, Bidar police, tracking the robbers, arrived in Hyderabad to apprehend them. Upon spotting the police, the robbers barged into the travel office in an attempt to flee, leading to a confrontation. During the exchange of gunfire, the manager of the office was shot and sustained serious injuries. Minister

Parameshwar assured the public that the perpetrators would

be apprehended as early as possible. He emphasised the necessity of installing security cam-eras and deploying security personnel whenever cash is being transported to ATMs. In response to the tragedy, District In-charge Minister Ishwar Khandre announced plans to visit the victim's family in 17 January to offer condolences, stating that an investigation would uncover what went awry in the security arrangement for cash deposits. —Salar News


The woman set herself afire by pouring inflammable material on her body.

Amid increasing use of artificial intelligence in campaigning and its potential to influence voter opinion, the Election Commission on Thursday issued an advisory to political parties asking them to promote transparency and accountability in the use of AI-generated content.

The advisory introduces labelling and disclosure norms requiring parties to clearly label any images, videos, audio or other materials generated or signifi-cantly altered by AI technologies with a notation such as "AI-Generated" "Digitally Enhanced" Enhanced"

"Digitally Enhanced" /"Synthetic Content". It also requires political par-ties to include disclaimers during dissemination of

campaign advertisements or promotional content, wherever synthetic content is utilised.

Election Commissioner Rajiv Kumar had recently cautioned against the potential of AI and deep fakes in compounding the malaise of misinformation.

He had expressed concern that deep fakes and misinformation have the potential to erode trust in electoral processes.

During last year's Lok Sabha elections, the Commission had issued guidelines for responsible and ethical use of social media platforms.

SC flays ED for not giving bail to women in PMLA cases

NEW DELHI, 16 JAN

The Supreme Court has delivered a strong rebuke to the Enforcement Directorate (ED) regarding its stance on bail conditions for women accused of money laundering, despite a clear statutory exemption under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA), 2002. A bench composed of Justices Abhay S Oka and Augustine George Masih was hearing the bail plea of Shashi Bala, a gov-ernment school teacher implicated in a money laundering scam linked to the Shine City

Group of Companies.

The court labelled the ED's arguments as "contrary to statute", emphasising that such positions would be met with intellerance Bele has been in intolerance. Bala has been in custody since November 2023, and the bench expressed con-cern over the likelihood of her trial concluding in the near



The ED had contended that the strict bail conditions outlined in the PMLA should apply to women as well. However, Section 45(1) contains a significant exception, stating that individuals under the age of sixteen, women, and those who are sick or infirm may be granted bail if directed by a Special Court. The Shine City Group has been accused of defrauding the public of between Rs 800-1,000 crore through deceptive investment schemes. —*PTI* Justice Viswanathan recuses himself from coal scam case

Justice KV Viswanathan of the Supreme Court recused himself from hearing coal scam cases, citing his prior involvement as a lawyer in one matter. 16 Sambhal mosques accused of 1,400 power theft cases

Since the violence during a court-ordered survey at the Shahi Jama Masjid here on 24 November, 2024, the district has seen an intensified crackdown on electricity theft, resulting in the registration of more than 1,400 cases, impli-cating 16 mosques and 2 madrasas.

"A fine of Rs 11 crore has been imposed in these cases, and nearly Rs 20 lakh has been recovered as of now. Superintending Engineer Vinod Kumar said.



Pollution, water quality in focus ahead of Delhi polls

head of Delhi Assembly polls on 5 February, residents across the national capital have raised concerns over a range of civic issues, including poor road conditions, water quality and rising pollution levels.

Mohammad Sadiq, a resident of Seelampur in northeast Delhi, highlighted the ongoing issue of contaminated water

"We have electricity, but the water quality is very poor. We have to buy clean water for drinking and cooking, which costs between Rs 30 to Rs 50 per day. The condition of the roads in our area is another major concern. We expects the next government to resolve these issues," he said.

Another resident from Hardevpuri, Durgapuri in northeast Delhi, Harsh Tyagi, pointed to multiple problems, including narrow lanes, lack of parking, and insufficient green cover.

"The pollution level in our area is high due to the lack of trees. The narrow lanes leads to parking congestion congestion and there is no proper drainage system," Tyagi said. In northwest Delhi, Nisha

In northwest Delhi, Nisha Sharma, expressed concerns about bad roads and stray cat-

tile.

"While we have access to electricity and clean water, the roads are in poor condition, with potholes everywhere. The main roads are fine, but the inner lanes in Trinagar and Wazirpur are in bad shape. Stray cattle is also a challenge, making it difficult to navigate through the area," Sharma said.

Environmental advocate Verhean Khanna, founder of the New Delhi Nature Society, stressed the importance of reducing reducing waste and increasing greenery to tackle

"We have to produce less amount of garbage, especially the plastic waste. There are some garbages which we cannot avoid. We need a proper and separate channels for disposing electronic wastes and biodegradable waste can be

converted into fertiliser," Khanna said.

"We have set up three pits in a park at our colony where we are converting the biodegradable waste, which we collect from the houses of the society, into fertilisers," he added.

Khushboo Tiwari, a resident of Chhatarpur, voiced concerns over drainage overflow during monsoons.

She said the Mehrauli-Gurgaon Road sees major traffic congestion, especially during peak hours. Additionally, the drainage system overflows during rains, creating difficulties for the residents.

There's also the issue of hanging wires and electric poles near homes, posing safety risks, she added. Tiwari further claimed that there is no park in their area for the residents.

Bittu Bhardwaj, a resident of southwest Delhi, said that after Anand Vihar, Palam is the most polluted area in the national capital.

"There is a lot of construction ongoing in this part of the city which causes high pollution level in the area. Palam is the second most polluted area in the national capital following Anand Vihar. The roads are in bad condition leading to traffic congestion in the locali-

ty," Bhardwaj said.
Sunil Kumar Aledia, executive director, Centre for Holistic Development, called for collective participation to address the pollution and civic

issues in Delhi.

He said the population density is increasing leading to extra burden on the waste creation in several forms posing a significant challenge.

The issue of climate change is not being properly addressed due to which the society is getting impacted, he he added.

"We need to have proper planning and participation of all stakeholders of the society to deal with the rising civic issues. We also need to aware people before seeking their participation. There are garbage mountains in Delhi which are not being disposed off properly," Aledia said.

He further said that the government should have a proper plan regarding the vehicles in the national capital. Voting for Delhi Assembly elections will take place on 5 February, with counting to be held on February —*PTI*

Bezos' Blue Origin launches rocket on first test flight

Blue Origin launched its massive new rocket on its first test flight Thursday, sending up a prototype satellite to orbit thousands of miles above Earth.

Named after the first American to orbit Earth, the New Glenn rocket blasted off from Florida, soaring from the same pad used to launch NASA's Mariner and Pioneer spacecraft a half-century ago.

Half-century ago.
Years in the making with heavy funding by Amazon founder Jeff Bezos, the 98-metre rocket carried an an experimental platform designed to host satellites or release them into their proper orbits. All seven main engines fired at liftoff as the rocket blazed through the predawn sky, drawing cheers from spectators lining the nearby beaches. Company employees erupted in shouts and frenzied applause once the craft successfully orbit 13 minutes later, a feat that drew quick praise from SpaceX's Elon Musk.

Musk.

"Congratulations on reaching orbit on the first attempt!" Musk said via X.

For this test, the satellite
was expected to remain
inside the second stage
while circling Earth. The
mission was expected to last
six hours, with the second
stage then placed in a safe
condition to stay in a high,
out-of-the-way orbit in
accordance with NASA's
practices for minimising
space junk. The first-stage
booster missed its landing
on a barge in the Atlantic
minutes after liftoff so it
could be recycled, but the
company stressed that the
more important goal was for

the test satellite to reach orbit. Bezos said before the flight it was "a little crazy" to even try to land the booster on the first try. New Glenn was supposed

New Glenn was supposed to fly before dawn Monday, but ice buildup in critical plumbing caused a delay. The rocket is built to haul spacecraft and eventually astronauts to orbit and also the moon

Founded 25 years ago by Bezos, Blue Origin has been launching paying passengers to the edge of space since 2021, including himself. The short hops from Texas use smaller rockets named after the first American in space, Alan Shepard. New Glenn, which honors John Glenn, is five times taller.

Blue Origin poured more than USD1 billion into New Glenn's launch site, rebuilding historic Complex 36 at Cape Canaveral Space Force Station. The pad is 14 km from the company's control centres and rocket factory, outside the gates of NASA's Kennedy Space Center.

Blue Origin envisions six

to eight New Glenn flights this year, if everything goes well, with the next one coming up this spring

ing up this spring.

"There's room for lots of winners" Bezos said from the rocket factory over the weekend, adding that this was the "very, very beginning of this new phase of the space age, where we're all going to work together as an industry ... to lower the cost of access to space."

The biggest rocket of all, at approximately 123m, is SpaceX's Starship. Musk said the seventh test flight of the full rocket could occur later Thursday from Texas.

He hopes to repeat what he pulled off in October, catching the returning booster at the launch pad with giant mechanical arms

mechanical arms.
Starship is what NASA plans to use to land astronauts on the moon later this decade. The first two moon landings under the space agency's Artemis program, which follows the Apollo missions of the 1960s and 1970s, will see crews descending from lunar orbit to the surface in Starships.

Blue Origin's lander, dubbed Blue Moon, will make its debut on the third lunar touchdown by astronauts.

NASA Administrator Bill Nelson pushed for competing moon landers similar to the strategy to hire two companies to ferry astronauts to and from the International Space Station. Nelson will step down when President-elect Donald Trump takes office on Monday.

Trump has tapped tech billionaire Jared Isaacman to run NASA. Isaacman, who has twice rocketed into orbit on his own privately financed SpaceX flights, must be approved by the Senate. New Glenn's debut was supposed to send twin spacecraft to Mars for NASA. But the space agency pulled them from last October's planned flight when it became clear the rocket wouldn't be ready in time. They will still fly on a New Glenn rocket, but not until spring at the earliest. The two small spacecraft, named Escapade, are meant to study the Martian atmosphere and magnetic environment while orbiting the

US TikTok users flock to Chinese app RedNote amid ban concerns

ocial media giant TikTok is preparing to shut down its app in the United States this Sunday – the day that legislation signed by President Joe Biden last year banning the app takes effect.

There is a slim chance this dramatic development might not happen if the US Supreme Court accepts a last minute legal argument from TikTok's Chinese owner, ByteDance, that the ban is unconstitutional – or if ByteDance divests its US operations.

But the 170 million users of TikTok in the US aren't taking any chances. Many self-described "TikTok refugees" have begun to flee to alternative social media sites, mocking the alleged security concerns on TikTok in the process. "Goodbye to my Chinese spy" has become a new TikTok trend.

The most popular alternative that has emerged is the Chinese social media app Xiaohongshu (known as RedNote in English). On 13 January, the app surged to number one in the US Apple App Store, attracting more than 7,00,000 new users.

This mass digital migration of social media users marks a new phase in the ongoing digital cold war between the US and China. But there are many questions about whether

RedNote – or any other alternative platform – will be a viable, long-term refuge for US TikTok users if the ban goes ahead.

Owned by Shanghai-based Xingyin Information Technology and established in 2013, RedNote is a Chineselanguage lifestyle, social networking and e-commerce platform. It has a hybrid style of Instagram-meets-Pinterest and approximately 300 million monthly active users – the majority of whom are in China.

RedNote stores its users' personal data in China, in compliance with China's data protection and cybersecurity laws and other regulatory policies.

But RedNote isn't the only alternative platform users are migrating to. Another is Lemon8, also owned by ByteDance, which bills itself as a "lifestyle community".

First launched in Japan in 2020, it had the second top spot in the Apple App Store – after RedNote – earlier this week. The app allows existing TikTok users to migrate their account handles and data.

Like TikTok, Lemon8 stores data of users outside China, including in the US and Singapore. However, if the US government does ban TikTok it could easily use the same

rationale to ban Lemon8.
Other local US-based alternative platforms, such as

Instagram Reels and YouTube Shorts, are not seen as ideal options by many users. This is because they are less creator-friendly and lack a strong sense of community.

Many see RedNote as the best alternative given its similar content style and algorithms to TikTok and community-driven appeal. More importantly, the platform is beyond the control

of the US government and cannot be directly banned. At the time of writing, the

At the time of writing, the hashtag "TikTok refugee" had garnered about 250 million views and over 5.5 million comments on RedNote. Some US users satirically explained their move to the platform out of spite: since the US government is worried about our personal data being taken by

China, let's just hand it directly over to the Chinese government. Are you going to take away my mobile?

Chinese users of RedNote are enthusiastically embracing TikTok refugees from the US. For example, they are producing tutorial videos to teach new users how to navigate the app. This hospitality is summed up by one popular

on the platform who said: "friends who come over from TikTok, I want to say, you are not refugees, you are brave explorers." The new migration to RedNote has also intensified national pride of Chinese internet users.

They vividly refer to the migration as a "Western awakening movement", which allows US citizens to open their eyes to see the world outside the centre of the west.

This phrase was coined in reference to the "self-strength-ening movement" in China in the late 19th century – a reform effort aimed at modernising China by adopting Western technologies, knowledge and values. The unexpected migration has seen some RedNoterelated stocks surge by as much as 20 per cent earlier this week. The positive interactions between American and Chinese internet users help promote the Communist Party of China's idea of "people-to-people diplomacy". This idea is best summed up by Chinese President Xi Jinping, who in July 2024 said: "The hope of the China-US relationship lies in the people, its foundation is in the two societies, its future depends on the youth, and its vitality comes from exchanges at subnational levels." However, RedNote might not be a viable, long-term refuge for US TikTok users.

Their sudden migration to RedNote could be more like a flash mob protest against the TikTok ban. It may not be easy for them to get used to a very different digital ecosystem – and make a decision to permanently reside on the Chinese app. RedNote has already posted a job ad to urgently recruit content moderators who understand English to cope with the dramatic growth of English-speaking users.

It's also worth nothing that

the migration to RedNote is still very small, and only a fraction of the 170 million people in the US who use TikTok. The US government also has

the authority to pressure Apple to remove RedNote from the US App Store if it thinks the migration poses a national security threat.Regardless of whether this happens, the mass migration of TikTok refugees to RedNote - even if it is temporary - shows the US's regulation of digital technologies, driven by geopolitical competition, has significantly fractured the global internet. Fortunately, we have witnessed the spirit of optimism and humanitarianism among US and Chinese internet users amid the tension of the digital cold war.



German cops probe AfD's mock plane ticket campaign

BERLIN, 16 JAN

Authorities in Germany have initiated a criminal investigation following the distribution of around 30,000 fake "deportation" flight tickets by the nationalist Alternative for Germany (AfD) party in Karlsruhe. The mock tickets resemble actual boarding passes and feature a oneway flight from "Germany" to a "safe country of origin" for a passenger named "illegal immigrant," scheduled for 23 February, coinciding with a snap federal election. Local politicians condemned the initiative as incitement to hatred, with the Left Party planning to file charges. Karlsruhe Mayor Frank Mentrup labelled the campaign as crossing a line, exacerbating fear within the community. -DW News

IS linked rebels kill at least 10 people in Congo

GOMA, 15 JAN

At least 10 people were killed in eastern Congo by extremist rebels linked to the Islamic State group, a local official said on Wednesday. The rebels with the Allied Democratic Forces, an IS affiliate in the region, attacked the village of Makoko in the Lubero territory of the North Kivu province on Wednesday, a provincial member of parliament, David Sikuli, told The Associated Press. Eastern Congo has strug-

gled with armed violence for decades as more than 120 groups fight for power, land and valuable mineral resources, while others try to defend their communities. Some armed groups have been accused of mass killings. The violence has caused nearly 7 million people to flee their homes.

Cuba begins prisoners' release amid US policy shift

Cuba commenced the release of several prisoners on Wednesday as part of dialogues facilitated by the Vatican. More than a dozen individuals, including tattooist Reyna Yacnara Barreto Batista, who was arrested during the historic 2021 protests, were set free. Barreto, sentenced to four years for public disorder, reported that she and eight men were informed of their release early in the morning. This move follows the announcement from President Joe Biden's administration regarding plans to revoke Cuba's designation as a state sponsor of terrorism. While the Cuban government stated the releases were not directly linked to the US decision, it cited the spirit of an upcoming Jubilee declared by Pope. -PTI

Drake sues Universal Music over diss track

lated as Drake has filed a lawsuit against Universal Music Group (UMG) for defamation linked to rival Kendrick Lamar's diss track "Not Like Us." The suit claims UMG promoted the track despite false allegations of pedophilia against Drake, which allegedly incited violence, including a shooting at his Toronto home. Drake's grievance, filed in federal court in New York City, seeks damages and accountability from UMG for its role in disseminating the track's dangerous content. UMG refuted the claims, asserting it has invested significantly in Drake's career. The legal action comes as the track is nominated for five Grammys, amidst escalating tensions between the two artists. Drake's legal team argued that UMG prioritised

profits over artist safety.

UK's Starmer in Ukraine; pledges 100-year partnership

KYIV, 16 JAN

British Prime Minister Keir Starmer arrived in Ukraine's capital on Thursday, announcing a commitment to secure the country's future for a century, just days before Donald Trump is inaugurated as US President.

Starmer and Ukrainian President Volodymyr Zelenskyy are set to sign a "100-Year Partnership" treaty in Kyiv, focusing on defence, rich marks Starmer's first visit to Ukraine since he took office in July, having previously met with Zelenskyy while in opposition.

Welcomed at Kyiv railway station by UK Ambassador Martin Harris and Ukraine's envoy to London, Valerii Zaluznnyi, Starmer reiterated the UK's strong support. Since Russia's invasion three years ago, the UK has pledged £12.8 billion (approximately USD 16 billion) in military and civilian aid and trained over 50,000 Ukrainian troops. Starmer will also announce an additional £40 million (USD 49 million) for Ukraine's postwar

recovery. However, uncertainty looms over US support under Trump, who has questioned the cost of assistance and expressed a desire to swiftly end the conflict. Kyiv's allies are working to bolster Ukraine's position



for potential future negotiations.

Starmer stated that the partnership aims to ensure Ukraine "is never again vul-nerable" to Russian aggression, citing the historical context of Crimea's annexation in 2014. Key aspects of the treaty include enhanced cooperation on maritime security and the tracking of stolen Ukrainian grain exported by Russia.

Zelenskyy and Starmer are also expected to discuss a proposal for Western troops to monitor a potential ceasefire, alongside Ukraine's aspirafor membership.

Biden warns of rising oligarchy

WASHINGTON 16 JAN

In a poignant farewell address, outgoing President Joe Biden cautioned against the rise of an ultrawealthy "oligarchy" in America, which he believes threatens the nation's democracy as he prepares to hand power to President-

elect Donald Trump.

Biden, who will be succeeded by Trump on 20 January, expressed concerns over the alarming concentration of wealth and power in the hands of a few individuals. "There are dangerous consequences if their abuse of power is left unchecked," he stated, highlighting the potential detrimental effects on democracy and citizens'

US REMOVES SANCTIONS ON BARC, TWO OTHER INDIAN COMPANIES

On Thursday, Dissanayake met Chinese Premier Li Qiang and Chairman of the Standing Committee of the National People's Congress Zhao Leji and pitched for more Chinese investment in his address to Chinese firms.

A day earlier, Dissanayake held talks with his Chinese counterpart Xi Jinping following which the two sides signed

"There is not one specific thing – no particular threat, no health issue and no big per-sonal issue," Hindenburg Research founder Nate Anderson wrote about his firm's closure in a letter post-

ed on the firm's website.
"The intensity and focus has come at the cost of missing a lot of the rest of the world and the people I care about. I now view Hindenburg as a chapter in my life, not a central thing

that defines me."
A graduate of international business management from the University of Connecticut, Nathan (Nate) Anderson founded a "forensic financial research" firm to specialise in spotting wrongdoings and frauds, or what it calls mannade diseases at companion made disasters, at companies around the globe and taking market bets against them.

Anderson named his firm

after the German airship, Hindenburg, which caught fire and crashed in 1937 in



what was seen as a man-made disaster as some 100 people were loaded on the balloon filled with hydrogen – the most flammable material in the universe.


