WASHINGTON DC, 20 JAN

Taking oath as the 47th President of US Donald Trump said that he would announce a "national emergency" at the southern border in Mexico and a "national energy emer-gency" that would allow oil extractors to "drill, baby drill" - issues that had been key campaign pitches and resonated with his 'Make America Great Again' (MAGA) supporters. Trump will also order the

government to recognise only two biological sexes and end federal diversity programmes.

"The golden age of America begins right now," Trump said in his inaugural address. Taking a page from Elon Musk, Trump also vowed to

Soldier killed in J&K encounter with terrorists

SRINAGAR, 20 JAN

An Indian Army soldier was killed following an overnight encounter with terrorists in Jammu and Kashmir's Sopore area, officials said on Monday. The soldier was injured in the exchange of fire with terrorists in a hideout at Zaloora Guijarpati in Sopore police district and died as he was being evacuated from the scene of the gunbattle, they said. Security forces laid out a cordon on Sunday when they noticed fire while busting a militant hideout. They maintained vigil at Zaloora Gujjarpati during the night and intensified searches for suspected terrorists in the area this morning, the officials said. -PTI

UK's top 10% held half of colonial wealth from India

Solicitor General Tushar Mehta raised concerns in the Supreme Court about the halal certification of non-meat products, such as cement and iron bars, during hearings on petitions challenging a direc-tive from Uttar Pradesh that prohibits halal-certified food products, except for exports.

Mehta expressed shock that even non-food items like cement and iron bars required halal certification, questioning why non-believers should bear higher costs for such certified products. H remarked, "How He can 'besan' be halal or non-halal?" highlighting the

confusion surrounding halal certifications extend-ing beyond meat. Counsel for the petitioners said halal certification is a lifestyle choice .They maintained that consumers voluntarily opt for halal-certified products, countering the solicitor general's assertion. -PTI

Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah on Monday demanded that Leader of Opposition in the Assembly R Ashoka should come up with evidence before making allegations of corruption against the State government.

Ashoka on Monday had dubbed the Congress-led Karnataka government as "60 per cent commission government" and further alleged that the money is being used for a "big rally" of the Congress.

SC denies custody of techie Atul's son to his mother

BENGALURU 20 JAN

The Supreme Court has ruled that the four-year-old son of Atul Subhash, the Bengaluru techie who died by suicide in December, will remain in the custody of his estranged mother, Nikita Singhania. This decision came on Monday following a plea by Anju Devi Subhach's mother Anju Devi, Subhash's mother, seeking custody of the child. The court, led by Justice BV Nagarathna and Justice SC Sharma, made the ruling after a video interaction with the child. Devi had requested a week's time to file a more detailed affidavit, but the court denied the request, emphasizing the urgency of the case. After a brief break, the boy appeared on the video link, and the court proceed-

ings resumed to protect his identity. Earlier, Singhania's lawyer informed the court that the child had been enrolled in a boarding school in Faridabad and would be withdrawn to accompany his mother to Bengaluru, where she is required to fulfill bail conditions.

Singhania and her family face charges of abetting Subhash's suicide. Subhash, 34, had accused his wife and her family of harassment in a video and suicide note before his death, sparking contro-versy over the misuse of laws meant to protect women.



Aero India to stall flights at KIA

BENGALURU, 20 JAN

The Kempegowda International Airport (KIA) is expected to face significant flight disruptions from 5 to 14 February, when the Aero India -2025 takes place at the nearby Yelahanka Air Force Station, airport authorities said on Monday. Both runways at the airport will be closed for several hours on each day of the air show, a statement issued by the airport said. The KIA statement said between 5 and 8 February, flight operations will be suspended for six hours daily. On 9 and 10 February the operation will be stalled from 9am to 12pm. On 10 February, not flight will take off or land between 2pm and 4pm. The run-ways will be closed between 12pm and 3pm on 11 and 12 February. Operation will also be suspended on 13 and 14 February for three hours each. The KIA, which handles over 40 flights per peak hour, is a major hub for domestic and international air travel. -Salar News VIJAYAPURA, 20 JAN

The owner of a brick manufacturing unit in Vijavapura held captive three labourers and assaulted them for three days for leaving work. The grievously injured trio has been admitted to the government hospital in Vijayapura.

Vijayapura Superintendent of Police Lakshman Nimbaragi confirmed that brick factory owner Khemu Rathod and his relatives assaulted labourers Sadashiva Madar, Sadashiva Babaladi and Umesh Madar using PVC pipes.

Rathod, who runs a brick factory at Gandhi Nagar, pays Rs 600 to the labourers for every eight-hour work day. They are also provided a common accommodation, police said

The trio, who proceeded on leave on 14 January to cele-brate Makara Sankranti, returned on 16 January and told Rathod that they were leaving the job. Enraged, Rathod gathered his relatives, locked the labourers in a godown and assaulted them for three days. APMC Police Inspector

Mallaiah Matapati said the trio was kept under illegally confinement in the godown and assaulted. Rathod later shifted the injured to the

hospital, he said. Vijayapura MLA Basangouda Patil Yatnal said that he has asked Nimbaragi to take strict action against the attackers. He said the labourers were held captive and assaulted for three days. "The accused must be punished seriously to avoid repetition of such acts in feature," Yatnal said.





Spurious liquor blamed for 7 deaths in Bihar Uddhav meets Sharad

BETTIAH, 20 JAN

Authorities in Bihar's West Champaran district have launched an inquiry following the deaths of seven individuals allegedly due to the consumption of spurious liquor in the region, which has been dry since 2016. Reports indicate that the fatalities came to light on Sunday, although the first occurred four days prior, meaning all seven deceased had already been cremated.

Superintendent of Police Shaurya Suman confirmed that all deaths were reported from the Lauriya police station area. While locals attribute the deaths to illicit alcohol consumption, Suman stated that two had different caus-

es: one victim was killed by a tractor, and another suffered a paralytic attack "The first death occurred on

15 January but we were only informed of the situation today. The reasons behind the other five deaths remain unclear since the bodies were cremated before police aware-

ness," Suman explained. West Champaran's Deputy

Development Commissioner, Sumit Kumar, noted the difficulty in determining the cause of death due to the cremation of the bodies. He highlighted the urgency of the investigation, instructing the team to provide a report within 24 hours. The team is also tasked with verifying the identities of those who died in Lauriya over the past few days.

One relative of a victim claimed, "My brother Pradeep consumed liquor with his friend Manish. Both have died.

The sale and consumption of alcohol have been prohibited in Bihar since April 2016 under the government led by Chief Minister Nitish Kumar. -PTI

India slips to 3rd spot on trust yardstick

DAVOS, 20 JAN

A recent study has revealed that India has slipped to third place in global trust levels towards government, businesses, media, and NGOs, according to the annual Edelman Trust Barometer released ahead of the World Economic Forum. This marks a concerning trend, particularly as low-income populations exhibit significantly less trust compared to wealthier individuals.

The report also ranks India low at 13th place in terms of international confidence in Indianheadquartered companies. Canada leads this category, followed by Japan, Germany, the UK, France, and the US. Countries such as Mexico, South Africa, Saudi Arabia, China, and Brazil also surpassed India. China maintains the top position for overall trust, while Indonesia has surpassed India for second

place due to an improved score. The survey indicates a stark contrast between income groups in India: 65 per cent of low-income individuals trust local institutions, compared to

80 per cent of high-income respondents. Globally, the research highlights alarming trends such as an increasing normalisation of violence and misinformation as means for

enacting change, with 63 per cent of respondents feeling unable to discern credible news sources.

Edelman's study, which surveyed over 33,000 participants across 28 countries, indicates that societal trust is deteriorating, with a significant majority (69 per cent) of respondents expressing concern that leaders in government, business, and media intentionally mislead the public. Furthermore, 53 per cent of younger respondents supported forms of hostile activism, reflecting a growing divide in public sentiment.

Despite trust in employers remaining the highest globally at 75 per cent, the survey reveals widespread resentment towards the wealthy, with many believing that the rich evade their fair tax contributions, contributing to societal problems. —*PTI*

KOLKATA, 20 JAN

Sanjay Roy, convicted of the rape and murder of an on-duty doctor at RG Kar Medical College and Hospital, appeared in court on Monday to assert his innocence, claiming he had been "wrongly held guilty.

The court on Saturday found Roy guilty of sexually assault-ing and throttling the doctor to death in August last year. "I am being framed and have not committed any crime. I have not done anything, yet I have been pronounced guilty,' Roy told the court before his sentencing. He also alleged that he was beaten in prison and coerced into signing documents.

Roy further asserted that when the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) took over the case, medical tests con-ducted at a railway hospital yielded no incriminating results. When questioned by the judge about his family, Roy mentioned that he had a mother, but no relatives had visited him since his arrest. He noted that he had been residing in a police camp prior to his arrest

The presiding judge. Anirban Das of the Additional District and Sessions Court in Sealdah, reminded Roy that the verdict was based on the evidence presented during the trial. Roy had already providextensive statements ed

during three hours of ques-tioning by defence and prosecution lawyers. The prosecution, represent-

ed by the CBI lawyer, sought the death penalty, labelling the crime as "rarest of the rare." They argued that impos-ing the maximum punishment was essential to uphold public faith in the justice system. Conversely, Roy's defence argued that the prosecution failed to demonstrate that he was beyond rehabilitation and pleaded for a sentence less severe than death.

Meanwhile, the parents of the deceased medic in the RG Kar hospital rape-murder case said that they were not satisfied with the verdict of the court pronouncing life imprisonment till death for the con-

vict. "We are shocked. How is this not the rarest of rare cases? An on-duty doctor was raped and murdered. We are dismayed. There was a larger

conspiracy behind this crime," the mother said. The judge said the crime did not fall under the "rarest of the rare" category, which justified not imposing the death penalty on the convict. —PTI

Kerala woman who poisoned lover gets death

A court in Kerala on Monday sentenced a 24-year-old woman to death for the murder of her boyfriend in 2022.

The convict, Greeshma, had sought leniency in sentencing by citing academic achievements, lack of prior criminal history and the fact that she is her parents' only daughter. In its 586-page verdict, the

court observed that there was no need to consider the con-vict's age and other circum-stances over the gravity of the crime committed.

The Victim, Sharon Raj, was a native of Parassala in Thiru-

vananthapuram district. The court observed that the convict conspired to operate the crime in phases, she had a criminal background as she attempted to murder the youth earlier and tried to end her life after the arrest to divert the investigation.

Expressing satisfaction with the judgment, Sharon's mother Priya said she was grateful



to the court for issuing such

an exemplary order. Special Public Prosecutor VS Vineeth Kumar said the verdict was fully justified and the court observed that the case fell under the rarest of rare category. "The court noted that the convict was a brilliant that the convict was a brilliant criminal, who meticulously planned the murder," he said. Kumar said despite Greeshma's belief that she could not be detected, scientif-ic investigation by the probe team led to her arrest.

The court also rejected Greeshma's claim that she had no criminal background, citing her attempt to poison Sharon by mixing paracetamol tablets into fruit juice. But it failed when he refused to drink it, on 22 August, 2022, Kumar said. -PT

Six booked in TN for assaulting SC teenager

Five cops responsible for Badlapur custodial death

A magistrate's inquiry has held five policemen responsible for the custodial death of Akshay Shinde, accused in the Badlapur school sexual assault case.

The officials involved included senior police inspector Sanjay Shinde of the Thane crime branch, assistant police inspector Nilesh More, head constables Abhijeet More and Harish Tawade and a police driver.

A bench of Justices Revati Mohite Dere and Neela Gokhale perused the report and said the government was



bound to register a case based on the inquiry and sought to know which probe agency would investigate the case. "The magistrate has conduct-

ed an inquiry and submitted its report. In the report, the magistrate has concluded that the five cops are responsible for the death of accused Akshay Shinde," the court said.

The bench noted that as per law, a first information report (FIR) should be registered against the five policemen, and an investigation must be

The Supreme Court on Monday directed the registrar general of the High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh to ensure proper video-conferencing facilities at a Jammu special court hearing two cases against jailed JKLF chief Yasin Malik and others. The SC bench also directed the Delhi High Court registrar general to ensure proper video-conferencing facilities in Tihar jail where Malik is lodged. The bench direct-ed both registrars to file status reports on 18 February and posted the hearing on the CBI plea on 21 February. "We have perused the observations made by the (special) judge (of the Jammu court). At two places, he has recorded that the video-conference system in his court was not functioning properly," the court said. —PTI

Central team in J&K village to probe 17 mysterious deaths

RAJOURI/JAMMU, 20 JAN

A high level inter-ministerial team on Monday visited Badhaal village in Jammu and Kashmir's Rajouri district to ascertain the cause of death of 17 members of three families under mysterious circumstances, officials said.

The central team headed by a director-rank officer in the Ministry of Home Affairs reached Rajouri district headquarters on Sunday evening and received a briefing from senior district, health and

police officers. Home Minister Amit Shah has ordered the constitution of the inter-ministerial team to ascertain the causes of deaths in the three families linked to each other in a remote village, about 55 km from Rajouri

SC seeks report on Mishra **'A CONCERNING MATTER'** Son moving court on father's burial shocks SC

NEW DELHI, 20 JAN

The Supreme Court expressed its dismay on Monday over a man's need to approach the highest court for permission to bury his father according to Christian rites in a Chhattisgarh village, after local authorities

failed to resolve the matter. Justices BV Nagarathna and Satish Chandra Sharma were hearing a plea from Ramesh Baghel, who challenged a decision from the Chhattisgarh High Court that dismissed his request for burial in a designated Christian area of the village graveyard.

"Why should a person who has lived in a particular vil-lage be denied burial there?" the bench questioned, noting that the body had been kept



Senior advocate Siddharth Dave, appearing for Ashish Mishra, opposed Bhushan's submission, saying his client was being targeted unnecessarily.



MIAMI, 20 JAN

Parents around Nora Sanidgo's large, rectangular dining table had lunch before signing documents to make the Nicaraguan immigrant a legal guardian of their children, entrusting them to her if they are deported. She gave a list of what to carry with them: birth certificates, medical and school records, immigration documents, her phone number.

"Talk to your children and tell them what can happen, let them have my phone number on hand, let them learn it, let them record it, Sandigo said Sunday. For the group at Sandigo's southwest Miami home and for millions in the United States illegally or with temporary legal status, the start of Donald Trump's second term as president on Monday comes with a feeling that their time in the US may end soon. Trump made mass deportations a signature issue of his campaign and has promised a raft of firstday orders to remake immigration policy. "You don't have to be afraid, you have to be prepared,' Sandigo told the group of about 20 people, including small children, who watched a demonstration of how to respond if immigration officers knock





From the time he left office after his loss in the 2020 presidential election to his nomination as the Republican candidate in the 2024 race, Trump continued to dominate the American news cycle and the country's psyche.

He refused to accept the November 2020 result that brought Joe Biden to the White House, and a stunned nation watched his supporters storm the US Capitol on January 6. The riots disrupted joint session of the US Congress which was in the process of affirming the presidential election results.

His third run for the job in 2024 was characterised by a slew of indictments and criminal cases, and a conviction in a New York court – making him the first former US president to be held guilty of a crime.

A grand jury found him guilty on 34 counts of falsifybusiness records. The ing Biden-Harris campaign said at the time that no one is above the law while Trump called the verdict the result of a "rigged" political system.

Just days before his swearing-in, Trump was sentenced to no punishment at all in his hush money case, with Judge Juan Merchan giving him an unconditional discharge.

Throughout all this, his ardent supporters have rallied behind him and his policies, including on the economy and immigration. The 2024 election took place

against the backdrop of concerns over the economy, illegal immigration and the wars in west Asia and Europe. Trump's support base saw him as the only one who could offer solutions to these.

"I will end the illegal immigration crisis by closing our border and finishing the wall, most of which I've already built," Trump told cheering supporters at his party's national convention, referring to the country's southern border.

Trump has also vowed that if he returned to the White House, "inflation will vanish completely"

Trump pledged to end the Russia–Ukraine war after Ukraine President Volodymyr Zelenskyy reached out to con-gratulate him on his Republican presidential nomination.

The four years of his second presidency will define not just how the US deals with its pressing domestic issues, it will also dictate its place in the world. The world is watching and gearing up. -PTI

Bitcoin soars past \$1,00,000 ahead of early action

LOOMING ERA OF GLITTER

WASHINGTON, 20 JAN:

The price of bitcoin surged to over USD 109,000 early on Monday, just hours ahead of Donald President-elect Trump's inauguration, as a pumped up cryptocurrency industry bets he will take action soon after returning to the White House.

Once a skeptic who said a few years ago that bitcoin "seems like a scam", Trump has embraced digital currencies with a convert's zeal. He has launched a new cryptocurrency venture and vowed on the campaign trail to take

steps early in his presidency to make the US the "crypto capital" of the world.

His promises include creating a US crypto stockpile, enacting industry-friendly regulations and even appointing a crypto "czar" for his administration. "You're going to be very happy with me," Trump told crypto-enthusiasts at a bitcoin conference last summer.

Bitcoin is the world's most popular cryptocurrency and was created in 2009 as a kind of electronic cash uncontrolled by banks or govern-ments. It, and newer forms of



cryptocurrencies have moved from the financial fringes to the mainstream in wild fits and starts

The highly volatile nature of cryptocurrencies as well as their use by criminals, scammers and rogue nations, has

attracted plenty of critics, who say the digital currencies have limited utility and often are just Ponzi schemes.

Trump promised that he would create a special adviso-ry council to provide guidance on creating "clear" and "straightforward" regulations on crypto within the first 100 days of his presidency.





RAMALLAH, 20 JAN

The first three hostages were released from Gaza and the first Palestinian prisoners were freed from Israeli custody as the fragile ceasefire between Israel and Hamas took hold following 15 months of war, with mixed emotions and more difficult steps ahead over the next six weeks.

According to a list provided by the Palestinian Authority's Commission for Prisoners' Affairs, all of those released are women or teens, the youngest 15. Israel detained them for what it said were offenses related to Israel's security, from throwing stones to more serious accusations like attempted murder.

The ceasefire that began on Sunday morning raises hopes for ending the devastating conflict and returning the nearly 100 remaining hostages abducted in Hamas' 7 October, 2023, attack. But major questions remain about whether fighting will resume after the

six-week first phase. In Tel Aviv, thousands of people who gathered to watch the news on large screens erupted in applause. For months, many had gathered in the square weekly to demand a ceasefire deal.

"An entire nation embraces ' Israeli Prime Minister you,'

Benjamin Netanyahu said. Over seven hours later, the first Palestinian prisoners were released. They had been detained for what Israel called offenses related to its security. Israel's military, which occupies the West Bank, which warned Palestinians against public celebration – the release took place after 1am – but crowds thronged the buses

after they left the prison, some people climbing on top or wav-ing flags, including those of Hamas. There were fireworks and shouts of "God is great". Those released were hoisted onto others' shoulders or embraced. The next release is due on Saturday, with 33 hos-tages and nearly 2,000 Palestinian prisoners and

detainees to be freed over the ceasefire's 42-day first phase. In just over two weeks, talks are to begin on the far more

challenging second phase. This is just the second ceasefire in the war, longer and more consequential than a weeklong pause in November 2023, with the potential to end the fighting for good.

HOUTHIS VOW TO LIMIT ATTACKS ON **ISRAELI SHIPS**

DUBAI, 20 JAN

Yemen's Houthi rebels have signalled they will limit their attacks in the Red Sea corridor to only Israe-li-affiliated ships as a ceasefire in the Gaza Strip took hold.

The Houthis made the announcement in an email sent to shippers and others on Sunday. The Houthis sepa-rately planned a military statement on Monday, likely about the decision.

The Houthis, through their Humanitarian Operations Coordination Center, made the announcement by saying it was "stopping sanctions' on the other vessels it has previously targeted since it started attacks in November 2023

The Houthis have targeted about 100 merchant vessels with missiles and drones since the Israel–Hamas war in the Gaza Strip started in October 2023, after Hamas' surprise attack on Israel that killed 1,200 people and saw 250 others taken hos-

The Houthis have seized one vessel and sunk two in a cam-paign that has also killed four sailors. Oth-er missiles and drones have either been intercepted by separate US- and European-led coalitions in the Red Sea or failed to reach their targets, which have also included Western military vessels.

Biden pardons Fauci, Capitol attack committee

WASHINGTON, 20 JAN

US President Joe Biden has pardoned Dr. Anthony Fauci, retired Gen. Mark Milley and members of the House committee that investigated the 6 January attack on the Capitol, using the extraordinary powers of his office in his final hours to guard against potential "revenge" by the incom-ing Trump administration.

The decision by Biden comes after Donald Trump warned of an enemies list filled with those who have crossed him him accountable for his attempt to overturn his 2020 election loss and his role in the storming of the US Capitol on Jan. 6, 2021.

Trump has selected Cabinet nominees who backed his election lies and who have pledged to punish those involved in efforts to investigate him.

"The issuance of these pardons should not be mistaken as an acknowledgment that any individual engaged in any wrongdoing, nor should acceptance be misconstrued as an admission of guilt for any offense," Biden said in a statement.

"Our nation owes these public servants a debt of gratitude for their tireless commitment

to our country." It's customary for a president to grant clemency at the end of his term, but those acts of mercy are usually offered to everyday Americans who have been convicted of crimes. But Biden has used the power in the broadest and most untested way possible: to pardon those who have not even been investigated yet. And with the acceptance comes a tacit admission of guilt or wrongdoing, even though those who have been pardoned have not been formally

accused of any crimes. Biden is also extending par-dons to members and staff of the 6 January committee, including former Reps. Liz Cheney and Adam Kinzinger, both Republicans, as well as the US Capitol and D.C. Metropol-itan police officers who testified before the committee.

China's Vice President Han Zheng held meetings with the US vice president-elect JD Vance and major business leaders in Washington on the eve of Donald Trump's inauguration, as the two major pow-ers tackle ongoing ten-sions over trade and technolo-

gy. Zheng, who serves as an envoy for Chinese President Xi Jinping at the inaugura-tion, "discussed a range of topics including fentanyl, balanc ing trade and regional stabiliwith Vance, Trump transi-tion team said. Zheng stressed the "exten-sive common interests and enormous space of cooperation" the US and China share in economic and trade relations despite "some disagreements and frictions", said a Chi-nese Foreign Ministry statement on Monday. Trump has threatened to impose tariffs and other measures on China and hinted

how the two rival powers could cooperate on issues such as regional conflicts and curb-ing the export of substances used in the production of fentanyl. In an unorthodox move, Trump last month invited Xi to his inauguration. No head of state has previ-ously made an official visit to the US for the inauguration, according to State Department historical records. While Xi will not personally attend the event, he and Trump held a phone call on Friday during which they



Bird flu hits Georgia, 1st outbreak since 2022

ATLANTA, 20 JAN

Bird flu hit a commercial poultry producer in Georgia, the US's top state for chicken production. All commercial poultry operations within a 10 km radius of the producer were put under quarantine and will undergo at least two weeks of surveillance testing. The site had about 45,000 broiler breed-ers when bird flu was detected. "This is a serious threat to Georgia's number one industry and the livelihoods of thousands of Georgians who make their living in our state's poultry industry," Agriculture Commissioner Tyler Harper said in a news release. In the last month, there have been 84 cases of bird flu across. –PTI

Bail hearing on Bangladesh Hindu priest next week

DHAKA, 20 JANUARY

Chinmoy Krishna Das Brahmmachari, the spokesperson of Bangladesh Sammilit Sanatani Jagran Jote, has applied for bail in the High Court in the sedition case on the charge of insulting the national flag of Bangladesh, a lawyer said on Monday. In that case, a lower court in Chittagong, the port city of Bangladesh, on 2 January gave an order rejecting Chinmoy's bail application, he said. "We have applied to the High Court on 12 January for Chinmoy's bail", Chinmoy's lawyer Apurba Kumar Bhattachariya, told ANI. "The court will hear the case according to the serial of the pending cases. LOS ANGELES, 20 JAN

Southern Californians are bracing for gusty winds and a heightened risk of wildfires, less than two weeks after deadly blazes killed at least 27 people and ravaged thousands homes. The National Weather Service has issued warning of a "particularly dangerous situation" for parts of Los Angeles and Ventura counties from Monday after-noon through Tuesday morning due to low humidity and damaging Santa Ana winds.

Gusts could peak at 113kmph along the coast and 161kmph in the mountains and foothills. Windy weather and single-digit humidity are expected to linger through Thursday, said Rich Thomp-son, a meteorologist for the National Weather Service. Thompson said the fire risk

is also elevated because the region hasn't seen rain since April. Critical fire weather with

wind gusts up to 97kmph was

also forecast for other Southern California communities on Monday and Tuesday stretching to San Diego, with residents urged to take steps

to get ready to evacuate such as creating an emergency kit and keeping cars filled with at least a half tank of gas. The warnings come as firefighters continue to battle two

major blazes in the Los Angeles area, the Palisades and Eaton fires, which have destroyed more than 14,000 structures since they broke out during fierce winds on 7 January The Palisades fire was 52 per cent contained on Sunday and

the Eaton fire 81 per cent contained, according to fire officials. California Governor Gavin Newsom has positioned 45 fire engines across the region in addition to water-dropping aircraft and hand crews to enable a quick response should a new fire break out, ac-cording to the governor's office of emergency -PTIservices.

China executes two for social revenge killings

BEIJING, 20 JANUARY

Chinese authorities on Monday executed two men who were involved in carrying out deadly social revenge killings with a car and knife last year, according to a media report.

The authorities on Monday executed a 62-year-old man who drove his car into people exercising outside a stadium last year, killing 35

people and injuring over 40, the report said.

Fan Weiqiu, who was stated to be angry over the division of the property after his divorce, carried out the attack a day before the Chinese military held its prestigious air show in Zhuhai City. He was executed less than

a month after a court sen-tenced him to death.

Let America own 50% of TikTok: Trump

WASHINGTON/ YORK 20 JAN NEW

TikTok is back in the US after President-elect Donald Trump on Sunday praised it and said let the gov-ernment own 50 per cent of the popular short video sharing platform.

TikTok went dark in the US on Saturday night because of a legislation, but it was back within less than 24 hours after Trump vowed to issue an executive order on his first day in office to delay the enforcement of the law.

The short-video app is used by 170 million Americans.

Who in this audience goes with TikTok? Many? Frankly, we have no choice. We have to save a lot of jobs. We don't want to give our business to China. We don't want to give our business to other peo-ple,"



Trump added. Stating that the solution to the TikTok issue is a joint venture, Trump said, 'They did that a long time ago when they had a different

president. They didn't know that I was going to be the president. So I said, very simply, a joint venture. If you don't approve, they're out of business. They're worth noth-ing. If you do approve, they're worth like a trillion dollars." During his first term as president, Donald Trump led the effort to ban TikTok, the hugely popular vid-eo-sharing app he said posed a threat to US national security

But on the eve of his return to the White House, the president-elect is being hailed as

the app's sav-iour. But the details remained murky and it was unclear whether Trump was proposing control by the US government or another company. Trump did not elaborate during a rally on Sunday night, where he hailed the move.

Trump ended up joining the app last year and has grown his following to nearly 15 million users. -PTI

Meme coins are a type of highly volatile cryptocurrency inspired by popular internet and carry no intrinsic value, however, its price can rise or reduce. The two coins are trading on the Solana block chain. Trump's meme coin witnessed a rise over the weekend and was trading at

over USD 70 by Sunday afternoon, according to CoinGecko, CNN re-ported. However, the coin's price reduced to USD 40 after Melania Trump launched her own coin.

Since then, it has recovered some of those losses and was trading around USD 60 early Monday while \$MELANIA was trading just over USD 12 early Monday, according to CoinGecko. \$TRUMP is the first cryptocurrency which has been supported by Trump, who once said that bitcoin was "based on thin air." -ANI

Billionaire wealth soars 3 times by \$2T in 2024: Oxfam

DAVOS, 20 JAN

Billionaire wealth across the globe surged by USD 2 trillion in 2024 to USD 15 trillion at a rate three times faster than the previous year, a study showed on Monday here as the richest of the world began to assemble for their annual jamboree in this ski resort town.

In its flagship inequity report released every year on the first day of the World Economic Forum Annual Meeting, Oxfam International contrasted the huge jump in the billionaire wealth with the number of people living in poverty barely having changed since 1990.

Wealth of billionaires in Asia increased by USD 299 bil-lion in 2024.

The year 2024 saw 204 new billionaires getting minted -an average of nearly four every week. Asia itself got 41 new billionaires in the year.

In its report titled 'Takers, not Makers', Oxfam said the richest 1 per cent in the Global North extracted USD 30 million an hour from the Global South through the financial systems in 2023.

NCLT orders liquidation of Go First airline

NEW DELHI, 20 JAN

The National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT) on Monday ordered the liquidation of Go First, the budget carrier that stopped flying nearly two years ago amid financial woes. In May 2023, the airline filed for a voluntary insolvency resolution process.

The tribunal, in a 15-page order, said it is ordering the liquidation of the cor-porate debtor Go Airlines (India) Ltd.

On Monday, the NCLT said the Committee of Creditors (CoC) in the legislative scheme is empowered to take the deci-sion to liquidate the corporate debtor, at any time after its constitution and before confirmation of the resolution plan. "It is well settled that the decision taken by the CoC for liquidation in commercial wisdom of the CoC should not be interfered with by the Adjudicating Authority. Further, the resolution for liquidation of the corporate debt-or was approved by the CoC

with 100 per cent voting. Therefore, this Adjudicating Authority sees no merit in interfering with the commercial wisdom of the CoC," it noted.

The order comes a little over two months after the Supreme Court, on November 7, 2024, ordered the liquidation of the once-storied airline Jet Airways, which had stopped flying in April 2019.

Go Air, which was rebrand-ed as Go First, flew for more than 17 years before suspending operations on 3 May, 2023. Dinkar Tiruvannadapuram Venkatasubramanian has been appointed as the liquida-tor. The liquidator has been asked to follow up and continue to investigate the financial affairs of the corporate debtor. "The liquidator shall also follow up the pending applica-tions for their disposal during the process of liquidation, including the initiation of steps for recovery of dues of the corporate debtor as per law," to the order. according -PT

Hindenburg denies US SEC investigation

TORONTO/NEW DELHI, 20 JAN

US short-seller Hindenburg Research has dismissed claims that it is under investigation by the US Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC), following allegations concerning its founder, Nate Anderson, and connections to a hedge fund in relation to potentially misleading reports.

In a statement, the firm asserted, "Hindenburg is not under investigation by the SEC, to our knowledge, and any suggestion to the contrary is false." This defence comes in response to a report from the Canadian portal Market Frauds, which cited court doc-

uments from a defamation lawsuit alleging Anderson had collaborated with Moez Kassam, head of Canada's Anson hedge fund, when creating Hindenburg's reports.

The portal claimed that this alleged partnership could lead to securities fraud charges, as it purportedly involves the creation of bearish reports without proper disclosure. Hindenburg countered these claims as "uniformly false," labelling the accusations as based on a "Tongan blog" filled with inaccuracies. They insisted their reports are compiled through rigorous independent verification.

AMORIM'S SHOCK CLAIM The worst Man United team in history?

MANCHESTER, 20 JAN

It has never been this bad at Manchester United.

Well, that's the opinion of the club's latest manager about his underperforming team: "We are being the worst, maybe, in the history of Manchester United," said Ruben Amorim on Sunday.

Here's a look at some of the numbers behind Amorim's comment, which came after a 3-1 loss to Brighton:

United is in the 13th position in the 20-team Premier League after 21 of 38 games. With 26 points, United is closer to the relegation zone than the European qualification places and on course for its lowest finish in the Premier League era (since 1992), which is eighth last year.

United is behind Premier League leader Liverpool, its

great rival by 24 points. The last time United had worse home form than this losses from its first 12 league games at Old Trafford.

The team has lost 7 out of the 15 games since Amorim he took charge in November to replace Erik ten Hag.

It is also to be noted that United had finished in the top two positions, 20 times in the 26 full seasons under manager Alex Ferguson, while it has finished in the top two position only two times since Ferguson retired in 2013. On both occasions, United was in second place.

Amorim is the 10th manager - either permanent or inter-im — appointed by United since Ferguson's retirement. The estimated worth of Man

United is \$6.55 billion, according to Forbes. That places the club in 14th place in Forbes' list of the world's most valuable sports teams in its most recent ranking. -PTI
